Who is Disability Services?

Who are we?

 Disability Services (DS) facilitates equal access for students with disabilities by coordinating accommodations and support services.

 We collaborate with many departments across campus to ensure students are able to fully participate in the Columbia experience.

Who are we?

- Team includes:
 - Intake and registration specialists
 - Case managers
 - Assistive Technology Specialists
 - Learning specialists
 - Accommodations Managers

Who do we serve?

Any currently registered Columbia student on the Morningside, Manhattanville, and CUIMC campuses can register with Disability Services.

Who is eligible to register?

- Students diagnosed with physical and/or mental impairments that substantially limit one or more major life activities:
 - Psychiatric Disabilities
 - Sensory Disabilities
 - Learning Disabilities
 - o AD/HD
 - Concussion
 - Temporary Conditions
 - Chronic Medical Conditions

What accommodations can I get at Columbia?

What accommodations are available?

- Academic Accommodations:
 - Assistive Technology and Alternate Format Materials (e-Text)
 - Note-taking Accommodations
 - Foreign Language Substitution or Modification
 - One-on-one meetings or workshops with Learning Specialists
 - Sign Language and Speech-to-text
 - Testing Accommodations

What accommodations are available?

- Campus Accommodations:
 - Elevator and Lift Access
 - Housing Accommodations
 - Service and Assistance Animals

How do I know if I quality for an accommodation?

- Register with Disability Services
- Attend drop-ins to consult with staff about options

How can I register with Disability Services?

How can I register with DS?

- Complete the registration form
- Review the disability documentation guidelines
- Collect other supporting information
- Submit registration form and required documentation
- Meet with Case Manager for mandatory orientation

Things to Remember

- Reach out early and register in case you need an accommodation in the future
- Register sooner rather than later so there's time to gather the required documentation
- Once registered, you can choose when to use accommodations
- Reasons for registration remain confidential
